Principal Burnette explained the importance programs have for every pathway, allowing students various opportunities for different aspects of their life. Mr. Burnette, Mr. Brazeau and Mr. Harris proceeded with an interview-type conversation with Mr. Lavoie and Mr. Neff. The initial steps when students express interest in a Coop program will have them explain their goals, interests, hobbies, and career direction in order that a suitable placement can be arranged. The value of experiential learning for students is evident and has changed perspectives on educational plans.

The delegation spoke of growing strong community partnerships so to provide more opportunity for our youth. A video testimonial from Grade 12 student Madison Harris was shown describing how her coop placement is leading her to becoming a registered apprentice made possible by the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP).

Acting Chairperson D. Kaiser expressed gratitude to the educators on behalf of the Board for their passion and the value this method of learning has for our youth.

11. OTHER BUSINESS

Vaccination for Children Ages 5-11

Superintendent B. McIntyre explained details of the Ministry of Health's recent announcement of the COVID-19 vaccination for children ages 5-11. RCDSB will continue to partner with the Renfrew County & District Health Unit by offering our school sites for this purpose. Mr. McIntyre emphasized that this activity will not occur during instructional time, rather will likely take place on weekends. Custodians will continue to support our buildings to remain safe and clean.

<u>Timetabling for Secondary Schools - Semester Model</u>

Superintendent J. Poirier shared that the Ministry of Education has announced that all secondary schools will be permitted to resume regular timetabling of 4 courses a day starting in February 2022. Ms. Poirier indicated that the Ministry has further added that with approval from local Public Health Units, the semester model can resume prior to the start of the winter semester. As such, we are awaiting direction in this regard from the Renfrew County & District Health Unit.

Clean Air Schools Initiative

Communications Manager J. Laderoute indicated that a demonstration event for the Clean Air Schools Program is taking place at Pine View PS tomorrow, November 24th, from 5:00-7:00 PM. The event will live demo the importance of HVAC optimization, as well as the aerosol duct cleaning process.

Petawawa Family of Schools Boundary Review – Public Information Session

Director of Education P. Buffone stated that on December 8, 2021 we are hosting a virtual information session for the Petawawa Family of Schools community as a follow-up to the recent Board decision to shift Herman Street PS grade 7 and 8 students to Valour JK-12 School and introduce Early French Immersion at Pine View PS effective September 2022. The event will be an opportunity to provide details and explain the process and timelines.

Indigenous Education Advisory Committee Meeting, 21 October, 2021

Very positive meeting with lots of good news to share.

- IE Lead Tina Nelson spoke about the close fit between the board's new strategic plan and the goals of the indigenous education initiatives and the associated action plan for the current school year.
 Referencing the strategic plan priorities, she noted the growing engagement inspired by partnership with the Algonquins of Pikwakanagan community since 2015, as well as more recent engagement with other indigenous peoples.
 Programs and activities in schools have not only empowered indigenous students, but have also enabled excellent new learning for all students and teachers as these initiatives have grown and spread through the
- 2. Building from the strategic plan, the IE action plan has four focus areas: engagement and awareness; supporting students; supporting educators; and using data. Some action items include a new self-identification form and outreach to make it easier to self-identify (aside: there are now about 420 self-identified indigenous students/staff), and the new IE page on the board website, that makes it easy for students, parents and others to access programs and services.
- 3. Following this overview, the committee heard reports from Jude Kelley at EDPS, Angela McGregor at OHS, Sandy Beinet at CDPS, and Michelle Belsher at Valour about the wide variety of curriculum connections, activities, engagement of teachers and volunteers contributing knowledge and skills, videos, books, artwork and much more many of these happening in Education Week and the Day of Reconciliation.
- 4. Graduation Coach Judy Ellis reported that she has travelled around to all 7 high schools, met almost all Grade 12 indigenous students and is now starting to get to know students in Grades 9 and 11. She organised a session for Grade 12s for post-secondary admissions and trades qualifications, and 'in her spare time' has started some cultural activities at MCS and Valour.
- 5. Having left the best to last, the big new news is the hiring of a second graduation coach, Logan Wright, who is Metis. Both Judy Ellis and Logan Wright were hired in partnership with community stakeholders to ensure a good fit with the community, and interviews used a story-telling approach to connect with the job requirements.
- 6. Enabling this big new news is the big issue of funding. There's a lot of new funding available, and Superintendent Cousineau will in a moment reveal where it is coming from. But hearing about it, and about our need to set a vision for what we want to accomplish with it, effectively put an end to progress through the agenda, as every member of the committee was eager to tell all the good ideas about what can be done if more funds become available.

Community EDI Forum - Tuesday 02 November 2021

On Tuesday, November 2nd, 2021, System Principal of Equity, Amy Johnson, and I took part in a community forum related to equity, diversity and inclusivity at the Best Western in Pembroke. The session involved leaders from a number of community agencies, including Family and Children's Services of Renfrew County, and launched a very important discussion related to our collective efforts to eliminate all forms of discrimination and systemic barriers throughout our organizations as an aspirational goal to strive towards. We made a commitment, as an organization, to host a future forum of the group at one of our school sites in the future, when health and safety protocols allow.

Visit to CFB Petawawa - Tuesday 02 November 2021

Board Meeting Chair's Update - Bryon Morris November 23, 2021

Student Senate Update: Student Trustees Taylor Novosedlik and Jazzlyn Abbott

Student Trustee Taylor Novosedlik:

On November 18th we had our second Student Senate meeting, it was a packed agenda. Some key highlights that were discussed were our conversations about our social media, promoting mental health in partnership with Lisa Lariviere through the sharing of resources and hosting activities during Mental Health Week in May, our work on introducing elementary students to student government, and our secondary school review led by Director Buffone.

Jazzlyn and I have set dates for upcoming initiatives we would like to take on such as our mental health week, our Senators are to have meetings with their individual School Support Counsellors, and we would like to have any resources, speakers, etc. planned within the upcoming months. Specific dates are included in our minutes. We discussed our plan for grade 8 elementary outreach, and we will have a separate meeting with the elementary reachout committee, joined by the grade 7 and 8 Guidance Counsellor as well as System Principal Jenny Smith. Following that we will soon begin to reach out to elementary P's and VP's. After some discussion on our social media pages we have made some ideas for board challenges in December such as a winter photography, and a holiday recipes challenge. We also went over what type of content we would like to see on our Instagram, topics like education updates, opportunities for secondary schools, individual school accomplishments and interactive challenges were all discussed. With the assistance of Tina Nelson, we also discussed our plans for Indigenous outreach as part of our equity portfolio with Equity Ministers. Lastly, we made plans to once again host a Student Senate and Trustee orientation prior to this year's election. Our plan is to have each school find a minimum of three interested students who are preferably in graded 10 and 11.

Student Trustee Jazzlyn Abbott:

In the past month, OSTA-AECO hosted our first hybrid conference, with around 70 Student Trustees in attendance between the virtual and in-person participation. With vaccine policies and mask mandates, we were able to host this in a safe environment. We received great feedback from our Student Trustees about the success of the conference, where we had the chance to introduce OSTA-AECO formally to new STs, have presentations to provide professional development, discussion periods to grow as a group, and special speakers such as Cathy Abraham and Deputy Minister Nancy Naylor. In our Public Board Council sessions, I was able to lead our group in chances to share learning experiences within our regions, and have a planning session regarding the publication we will be releasing about student success. The Executive Council has also been keeping busy while writing initial drafts of the *Student Blueprint* document, an election platform, and with the *Student Trustee: Today and Tomorrow*.
